SILVER BEAVER NOMINATION

The Silver Beaver Award is a national award presented by councils. Annually, the council president will appoint a Silver Beaver Award committee that will consider candidates and make recommendations.

The award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters within the territory under the jurisdiction of a local office.

Recipients of the award will receive a certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor, and a miniature silver beaver suspended by a blue and white ribbon to be worn around the neck.

NATIONAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING

National Youth Leadership Training is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others. In 2019, 94 youth in the Middle Tennessee Council participated in NYLT. The courses were under the leadership of James Moore and Andy Daniels.

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must BE, what he/she must KNOW, and what he/she must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.

NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Interconnecting concepts and work processes are introduced early, built upon, and aided using memory aids, which allows participants to understand and employ the leadership skills much faster.

The Scouts will be able to take the information learned back to their individual troops and crews to provide leadership in making their unit stronger. Two courses will be offered in 2020 – May 24-29 and July 19-24. The May course will be led by Rick Di Silvio with the July course being led by Andy Daniels.



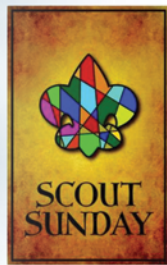

SCOUT SUNDAY

The Boy Scouts of America designates the Sunday that falls before February 8 (Scouting Anniversary Day) as Scout Sunday, which is the primary date to recognize the contributions of young people and adults to Scouting. However, with the founding of the original Council of Middle Tennessee on March 1, 1920, we are asking every charter organization to hold Scout Sunday on March 1, 2020 to help us celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the Middle Tennessee Council.

We understand many organizations adopt a specific Sunday to celebrate Scout Sunday, but we are asking you make the 100th Anniversary a part of the program. It is also permissible for a local church to celebrate on the Sunday most acceptable to the pastor and congregation. Please upload pictures using #100MTCSoutSunday.

12 POINTS OF THE SCOUT LAW PATCH SET

You may be asking how can my unit participate in the 100th Anniversary celebration of the Middle Tennessee Council? A special program has been developed to allow unit programming to focus on the 12 points of the Scout Law.

Units are encouraged to set aside time to focus on each point of the Scout Law. This can be done in the Dens, Packs, Patrols, Troops, Crews, or Ships. The Scouts decide how they will accomplish each point and the unit will recognize them with the patch of the point they complete. This can be completed in any order; we just want every Scout to earn all 12 points of the Scout Law Patch Set. Scouts can complete specific requirements for each patch anytime between January 2020 and May 2021 and earn all 12!!

COFFEE TABLE BOOK TO COMMEMORATE 100TH ANNIVERSARY

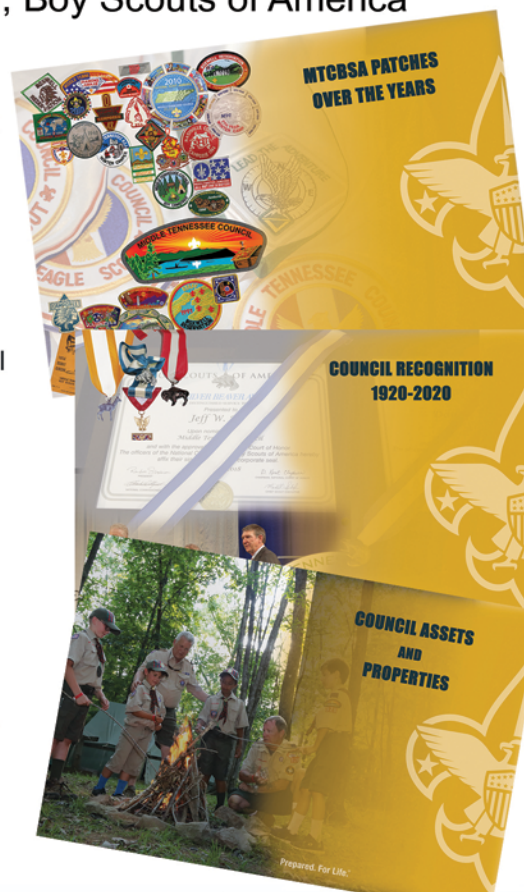

Taking on Projects like building a new camp road into Camp Boxwell when it was at Rock Island, to building and funding improvements to Boxwell Reservation's William C. Weaver Order of the Arrow (OA) Amphitheater, the Josh Sain High Adventure Gateway, the Stahlman campfire stage, and constant improvements to the Howard B. Olson OA Lodge. The lodge provides more than 2,000 hours of service to the reservation yearly. The lodge created, manages, and staffs Winter Camp, at Boxwell for 16 years and Latimer Reservation for 5 years. The Wa-Hi-Nasa Lodge was one of the first groups at Latimer Reservation to help in the construction of the Bee Creek Trail along with several other projects.

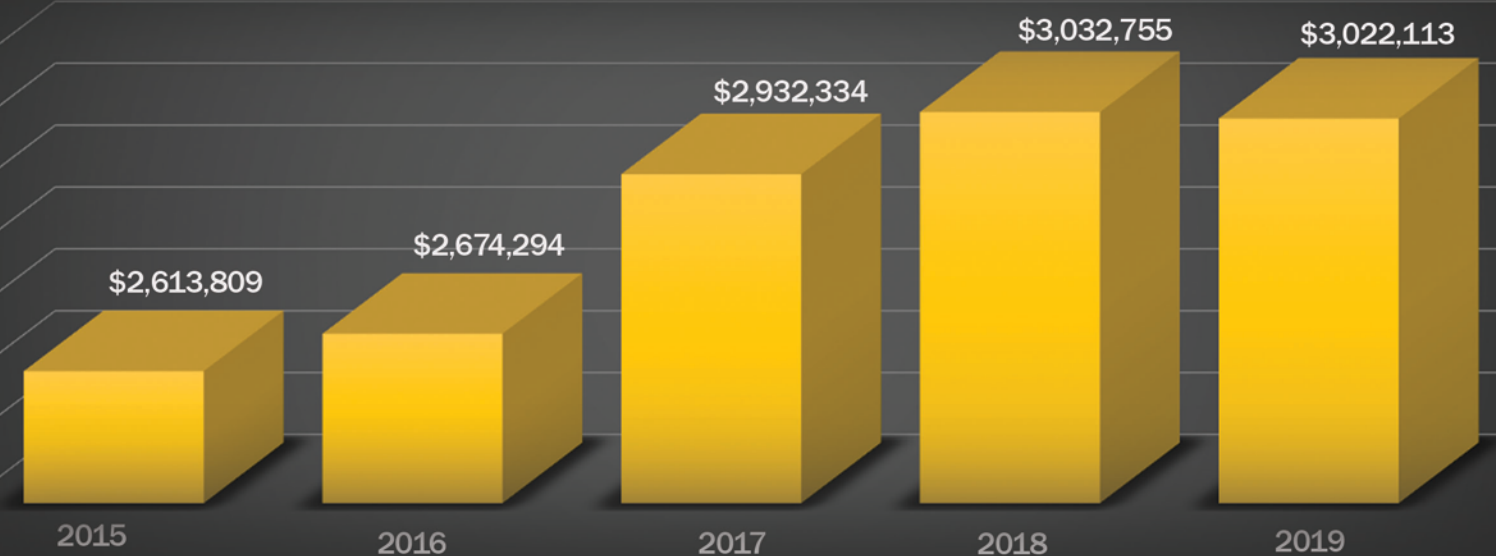

BOXWELL CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Boxwell plays a central role in the attraction and retention of Scouts and in helping them to learn and advance in rank. Current facilities at Boxwell Reservation are inadequate for this challenge. With this in mind, the Executive Board of the Council approved a \$12 million capital campaign. The Building for the New Century: A Campaign for Boxwell Reservation will address this need. According to Clay Bright, VP of Properties, Council Executive Board, "Upgrading our camp property was identified as a top priority in the Council's 2017-2021 strategic plan. The new and renovated facilities will improve the quality of the camp, food service and programs offered. This will help us meet our mission of serving youth at a critical time in their lives." The campaign is still in its quiet phase so you will hear more about it as we move toward the public launch.
